Tailgate medicine consists of dispensing medications, bandaging and splinting, and performing simple emergency life sustaining procedures. It is performed at the "tailgate" of a vehicle using an easily reached set of medical supplies and equipment. Mobility of the unit is not affected; only three to five minutes are required to open or close this service.
